BACKGROUND NOTE

Born in Steeleville, Illinois, on June 14, 1899, Joseph H. Hartley was the son of Allen D. Hartley and Nellie C. (Bundy) Hartley. He spent much of his career working as a draftsman, commercial artist and later personnel director for the Lincoln Telephone & Telegraph Company in Lincoln, Nebraska. He married Lucile Brown on April 23, 1921. They would have four children.

Hartley was a member of numerous organizations including the Scottish Rite, Sons of the American Revolution, Order of the Eastern Star, and the First United Methodist Church. He also served as past master of Lancaster Lodge 54, A.F. & A.M. and as past president of the Frank Woods Telephone Pioneers Association.

Joseph "Joe" Hartley died in Lincoln on November 3, 1990. His wife Lucile died in 1983. Joe and Lucile Hartley are buried at Cook Cemetery in Johnson County, Nebraska.
