HISTORICAL NOTE

Rulo is located on the Missouri River in Richardson County, Nebraska. The land was originally part of the land granted to the wife of Charles Rouleau and the town of Rulo was named after her.

Rulo was first platted in 1856 and incorporated as a village January 8, 1858. The town was made a city by the Territorial Council, November 1, 1858. It currently holds the class of village with a population of 226 in 2005.

The building of a bridge in 1885 on the Missouri river at Rulo contributed to the growth of the town. It was also a stopping point on the way west during the expansion period.
