HISTORICAL NOTE

The site of Fort Niobrara, Nebraska was selected in 1879, and a military reservation was laid out east of present Valentine in Cherry County. The fort was originally designed to guard the nearby Rosebud Indian Reservation in South Dakota.

In 1882, the town of Valentine established near Fort Niobrara proved to be a valuable asset providing a ready market, which stimulated the growth of the town and surrounding region.. Fort Niobrara was closed in 1906 and 16,000 acres of the military reservation were set aside as the Niobrara National Wildlife Refuge.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

This collection consists of records of Fort Niobrara, Nebraska arranged in two series: (1) Official Records on microfilm, 1880-1906 and (2) documents and correspondence relating to the history of the fort and establishment of a wild life refuge.

These records consist primarily of post returns from Fort Niobrara, Nebraska, 1880-1906 relating to the troops and activities at the Fort during the period. These post returns were purchased from the National Archives in June 1972. One film strip contains a record book of the Post Cemetery, filmed by the NSHS in 1957 form an original in possession of the Superintendent, Fort Niobrara Game Refuge.
