HISTORICAL NOTE

The Lewis and Clark Centennial Exposition was held in Portland, Oregon, June to October, 1905. The Exposition was to commemorate the Centennial Anniversary of the exploration of the Oregon country by the expedition commanded by Captain Meriweather Lewis and William Clark and planned by President Jefferson. There were eight principal structures, and, in addition, there were various state, territorial, and other minor buildings, including an administration building. Nebraska was among the sixteen states and 17 foreign countries represented at the Exposition.
