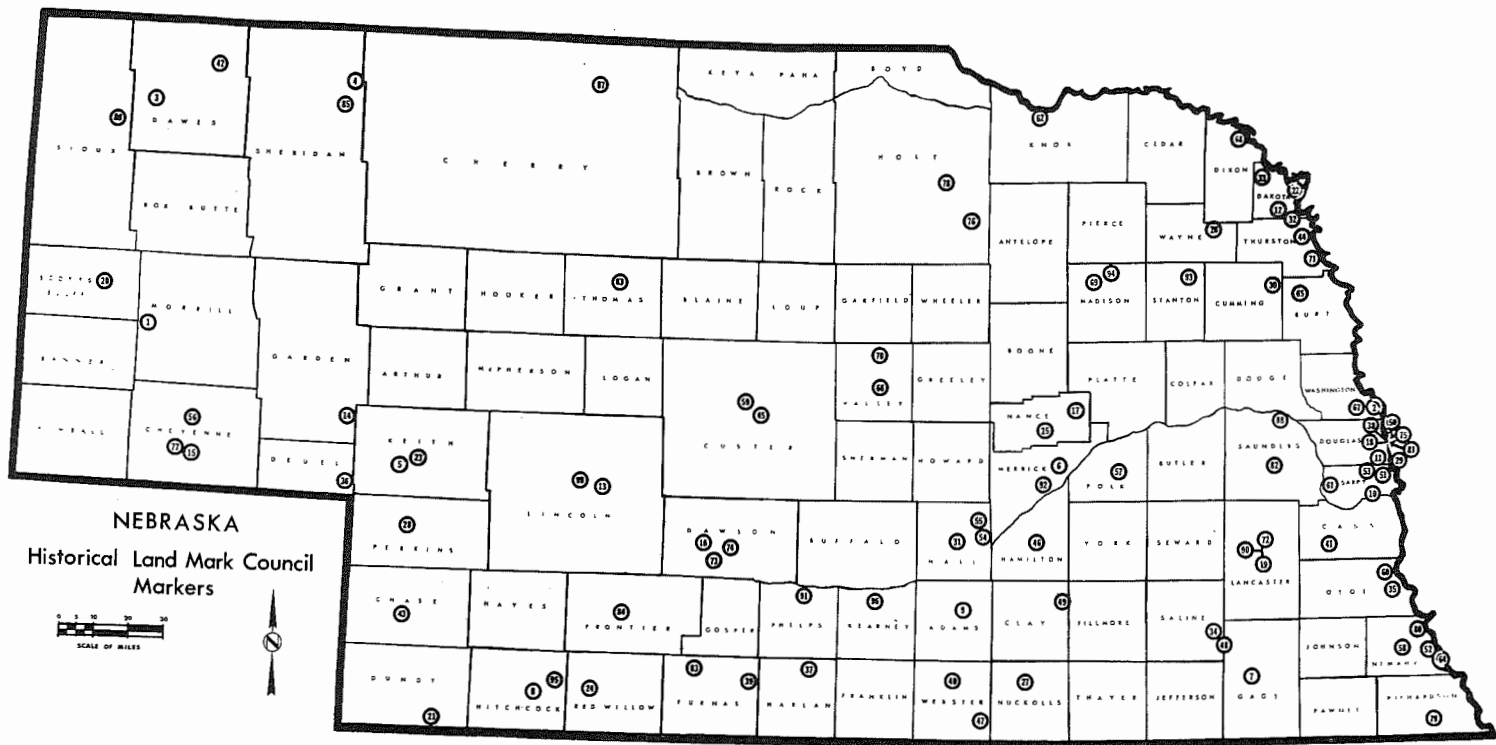

HISTORICAL LAND MARK COUNCIL

In the 1964 September issue of *Nebraska History* we provided a report on the work of the Historical Land Mark Council with a list of twenty-eight markers which had been erected. The first marker was dedicated on May 20, 1961, for Fort Atkinson in Fort Calhoun.

With the passage of L.B. 1147 by the last legislature the responsibilities for the marker program are transferred to the Nebraska State Historical Society. The list of markers which follows are approximately in the order in which they were erected. The outstanding progress of the program would not be possible without the close cooperation of the State Department of Roads.
