## **BACKGROUND NOTE**

Born in Lincoln, Nebraska in 1903, Philip Seacrest Hardy attended Lincoln High School and Hill Preparatory School (Pottstown, Pennsylvania). He graduated from Yale University in 1926. Hardy returned to Lincoln and joined his father's furniture business, becoming president of the business in 1935. In 1967 he moved to Washington DC and joined the Smithsonian Institution as a consultant to the museum shops director. Philip S. Hardy died in Washington, DC, in June of 1972.

# SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The Philip S. Hardy collection is arranged in four series: (1) correspondence (1910-1949); (2) diaries (1920-22) (1936-37); (3) mementos of Hill School and from Yale; (4) miscellaneous cards, clippings, brochures, etc.

The material in the Philip S. Hardy collection is primarily family correspondence relating to his years in high school, college, and his travels abroad.

The Hardy material was received from Mr. Hardy, February, 1960. In general, they have been left in the order received, arranged chronologically by year.
