BACKGROUND NOTE

Born on a farm in Jefferson County, Ralph A. Koch was the son of John M. and Alice (Burns) Koch. He graduated from Fairbury High School in 1898 and went on to attend the U.S. Naval Academy at Annapolis, Maryland, where he graduated in 1902. Koch served on various vessels throughout his career and was once commanding officer of the cruiser Marblehead. He also commanded submarines and became an expert on anti-submarine warfare. Koch retired from the U.S. Navy prior to World War II, but he was called back to active service and served in the Navy Department in Washington D.C. during the war. Ralph A. Koch died at the Bethesda Naval Hospital on March 14, 1953. He is buried at Arlington National Cemetery.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The collection consists of correspondence, publications and ephemera relating to the life and military career of Ralph A. Koch. The bulk of the collection consists of letters written by Koch during his time as a midshipman at the U.S. Naval Academy and subsequent career with the U.S. Navy. The letters are to his family in Fairbury, Nebraska and date from ca. 1899-1941. Also included are two yearbooks from his time at the Naval Academy and a souvenir yearbook from the U.S. Battleship Wisconsin, ca. 1903.
