BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Born in Wenona, Illinois in 1856, Arley Barthlow Show was a graduate of and later Professor of History at Doane College at Crete, Nebraska. He later became a member of the faculty at Stanford University. He would marry Buchephilia Wolph and have five children. Arley B. Show died in Palo Alto, California in October of 1938.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

This collection consists of three boxes of material arranged in series: 1) Correspondence, 1889-1919; 2) Research material; and 3) Miscellany.

The material in the Show collection relates to the history of the settlement of Fontanelle by the Nebraska Colonization Company, and to the founding of Nebraska University in Washington County, as well as to histories of colleges and education generally in Nebraska. Professor Show assembled the original records of the Nebraska Colonization Company and of the Nebraska University, from which these transcripts were made. These records are filed separately and are in such a deteriorated state as to be mostly illegible now. (The originals of the Nebraska Colonization Company are in MS527).
