

REPORT CARD NEWMAN GROVE PUBLIC SCHOOLS



NEWMAN GROVE, NEBRASKA. 1902-1903. The Ellaworth family is an ancient one. It had its origin in Yorkshire England before the Reman invasion.

The pregeniter of the Ellsworth family in America, was a decendant of pithichita/Sir John Ellsworth of the time of Edward vd. we find that in 1672 Sir Richard Ellsworth was privy Counsler to Charles lv. Josiah Ellsworth was born in 1629. He came to Commeticut in 1646. On the 16th. of November1654 he married Elizabeth Helcomb and settled in East Windsor Connecticut. The Ellsworths were noted for honesty, bravery, and patriotism. When the Collenies were Greaning under the burdens imposed by Great Britain declared their indipendance. Elewn Ellsworth rallied to the support of their native land and engaged in the war for indipendance. A prominent member of the Ellsworth family was Chief Justice Cliver Ellsworth. he was a the member of the Constitutional Convention assembled in Philidelphia in May 1787. He bore a distinguished part. It is said of him that to his clear discornment and strenuous exertions, coupled with those of his distinguished colluagues Roger Sherman and Judge Patterson, we owe the best government on eacht.

In 1789 he was elected U.S. Senater from Connecticut. He was one of the Framers of the Framers of the Constitution of the U.S. and 3d. Chief Justice, under Washington. John Adams said of him at this time, that Ellsworth was one of the firmest pillars of the adminstration of Washington. In 1799 he was appointed member of a Commission to make a treaty with France. Daniel Webster on one occassion in the Senate reffered to Ellsworth as a gentleman who had left behind on the records of the Government of his country proofs of the clearest intelligence and the utmost purity, and integrity of character. he graduated from Princeton in 1766. and was admited to the bar in 1771, shortly after this time he was married to Miss Abigail Wolcott.

Another prominent member of the Ellsworth family was William Wolcott Ellsworth, Governor of Connecticut from 1838 to 1942.

In the Civil war many of the Ellsworths were engaged.netably Col. Elmer Ellington Ellsworth, unfertunately lost his life early in the great struggle, when he was shot as he was tearing down a rebel flag, from the flag staff on a hotel on the banks of the Patomac River below Washington.

Gen. Nawberry of Chicago is a decandant of the Ellsworths family on his mothers side.

The mother of Judge Henry W. Shepard of Chicago was the daughter of John Ellsworth of East Windsor.

The Ellsworths have been noted for their wisdom and strength of character, and have borne their share of the labor in originating and building up the government of the United States.

DIVORCE DECREE.

This cause coming on to be heard before me, E.F. Lester, Judge of the District Court in and for Latimer County, Oklahoma, on the 28 day of May 1919 a regular court day of said court, upon the petition of the plaintiff and the defendent having been served by publication in this cause more than forty one days before this day; and having been three times called to appear, plead, demur or answer comes not but wholly makes default; and the court having ordered that the allegations in the petition of the plaintiff be taken as confessed, and having heard the oral testimony of the the witnesses sworn and examined in open court, and being fully advised in the premises, and on consideration thereof, finds that all the material allegations and facts alleged in plainties's petition are true; that flaintiff at the time of filing said petition was and had been an actual resident bin good faith of the State of Oklahoma for more than one whole next preceding the filing of said petition and was at the time of filing said petition an actual resident of Latimer County in good faith, and that the parties to this action, had been legally married as in said petition set forth;

The Court further finds that the said defendent has been guilty of desertion and abandonment, without the fault of the plaintiff for the space of one whole year before the filing of the petition herein, and had not communicated with plaintiff during all of said time.

And the court finds that the plaintiff is without fault in the premises and that by reason of the fault of the defendent, and the acts of the defendent, the plaintiff is entitled to a decree of divorce as prayed for.

It is therefore ordered, adjutged and decreed by the court that the marriage relation heretofore existing between said plaintiff and said defendent be and the same is hereby dissolved and both parties are released from the same, and that plaintiff be restroted to the name of Ella Black.

It is further ordered by the court that this decree do not become absolute and take effect until six months from the date hereof.
