Corns. besides mellons, peas & a big garden. you ought to have seen Bub coming up with a big fish, singing & hollering. and you ought to have seen us trudging along over there in an ox cart and back the same way. We have such a nice place here. so sightly and pretty. And such a good garden. but most of the things will be late as something took all the first things. Oh! how I want to see you, & Addie tells all the time about Charlie. every body I see & I see we think it is you coming. why dont you come over. we have got only 30 young chickens & 5 young turkeys. we have bad luck. & the old roquish hens & naughty turkeys are so bad in the garden. we have to keep them shut up. the Ducks are running all the time, one is whistling now. I have been up this morning. Ma got so so many things from Mr. Batchesams garden in Columbus. little (Dollie) <sup>for the lake</sup> (Addie's name) Rosa Batchesam is the prettiest little bright thing you ever saw. she is the smallest little thing you ever saw. Ma says you go to Miss Otis and get her riding hat and tell her that she must send the amount of the bill and she will send the pay by you when you go back. be sure and get it. Ma has sent for it 4 or 5 or 6 times. we have a big cow with the prettiest hifer calf in the country. & a 2 year old hifer with a calf. Pa thinks they are the best cows in the Territory. Pa is sick all the time most. Addie has got well. I am not well. Addie has got a little Kitty but he torments it most to death. every time he sees a scrogger or any body coming he claps his hands & hollers maggy and Charlie's coming. come over the last of this week and stay till after the 4th of July. come and stay several days. how do the people get along in that awful and wretched place, Glenwood? this is such a <sup>pretty</sup> place. its improving.
