LT. DEAN A. WOODS KILLED IN ACTION

Lt. Dean A. Woods, nephew of Mr. and Mrs. D. F. Todd, who made his home with them, has been killed in action in France. Mrs. Woods, who is making her home with her parents in Lincoln received a telegram last week stating he was missing in action. This week Monday, Mr. Todd received a letter from Dean's captain enclosing several personal items and referring to Dean's death but adding no further word.

Both Mrs. Woods and Mr. and Mrs. Todd received letters from Lt. Woods dated July 13 in which he said he was going to be unusually busy for a time and mail might be slow getting through.

Lt. Woods entered the service April 27, 1942 and was commissioned a second lieutenant, May 12, 1943 at Fort Benning, Georgia. He was sent overseas in April of this year.

Dean was graduated from the Milford High School in 1928 and began an apprenticeship in the printing trade at the Milford Review that September. In the spring of 1930 he was employed by the Boomer Printing Co. in Lincoln where he was employed at the time of his induction.

FORMER MILFORD RESIDENT DIES
