country is really beautiful & from what  
I heard I haven't seen the prettier  
part & as we are confined it is doubt-  
ful if I shall.

Naturally we are all looking at the most  
optimistic side & hoping that before too  
long a period of time has passed we  
shall be able to return home. At least it  
is nice to know that things have now  
taken a much more different shape &  
that the acute work will have subsided.  
The first step has been taken among  
all hands along the coast line. Peace is  
the predominating & wish by not to

far behind you can see that it isn't at  
all bad. Naturally the only milk we  
get is powdered, but with an effort you  
can get used to it. I've had 4 fresh  
days since I've been over + that is a  
treat in itself. Hello my.

Rationing is pretty stringent here. Per  
week we get 7 pounds of vegetables at 5¢ per  
3 bars of candy, 4 pounds of coffee, 1 bar  
soap, 1 soap flake + a few odds + ends. The  
only complaint being the candy, for some  
reason now that I can't buy it I  
own it.

I want you two letters which were returned  
to me from Jackson. I hope you had a  
nice vacation + I know you did.

Received a letter from Brother. He is on  
duty in camp. Say hello to Dick +  
tell him to remember this as long as possible.
