Satisfactory testimony having been presented to this office by late Special Commissioners Mott and Crawford, showing the statements of the chiefs "Smuttery Bear" and "The man who was struck by the Ree", which induced the supervision of 22 of the cases above specified, were incorrect, and being satisfied from the evidence in regard to the two remaining cases of William E. Sloan and the Heirs of Pelagie Ritter, pertaining to a contest respecting a tract of land at the mouth of the Little Nemaha River. That William E. Sloan is entitled to the land is controversy, I therefore respectfully recommend that the supervision of the foregoing 24 cases, as particularly specified in the above certificate dated the 14th of March 1860, may be withdrawn or set aside and that the location of land in these cases reported by late Special Agent Starke may be approved with a view to the emanation of patents in favor of the respective parties.
