QUESTIONS BY MR. PAHRMBRUCH:

Q- Charles, I'm Dale Fahrnbruch, the Chief Deputy Attorney,
Elmer's assistant, and I help him out in these cases,
and I wanted to talk with you a little bit about these
cases because I've talked with Caril, and I've been the
only one from our office talking with her, and I wanted
to get a few things cleared up.

Now you have given a statement to Mr. Scheele and Sheriff Karnopp, Bob Stein, and Mr. Shamberg here, the

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ecurt reporter, took it down, and you read it and signed it, is that right?

A- Yos.

Q- And that was on, the statement was taken on February lst here at the Fenitentiary.

Now, of course, you know that this, these questions and answers, are being taken down by the court reporter on his machine, you know that, don't you, Charles?

A- What?

- Q- You know what's being taken down here, what I'm saying and what you are saying, you understand that?

 A- Yes.
- Q- And you also understand that this can be used in court?
 A- What?
- Q- You understand that this can be used in court too?
- Q- And are you willing to answer my questions freely and voluntarily?

A- Yep.

Q- Now I haven't made any threats or premises to you of any nature, have I?

A- No.

- Q- And the answers that you are going to give me will be the truth, is that right?
 - A- Yes.

- Q- Now, Charles, you have previously in your statement taken on February 1, 1958 here, and that I have referred to, have given some information about being out at the Bartlett home, the Marion Bartlett home, at 924 Belmont, is that correct?
 - A- Yes.

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Q- And you have listed in detail in your confession of Pobruary 1, 1958 the details relative to the killing of Mr. Bartlett and Mrs. Bartlett and their little girl, is that right?

A- Yes.

Q- Now there are some things in there relative to that and Caril Pugate's participation that I'd like to talk to you about and ask you some questions.

Now as I understand it, Charles, you have known Caril Pugate for about eighteen months, is that right, about a year and a half?

A- Yes.

- Q- New on Tuesday, on January 21, 1958, about what time did you go to the Bartlett home, approximately?
 - A- About 1:30, 1 o'elock.
- Q- And would that be in the aftermoon?
- Q- How did you get over there, Charles?

- Q- And what type of ear was that?
 - A- A 149 Ford.
- 8- And what color was it, Charles, black?
 - A- Tob.

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- Q- And did it have any populiarities about it; in other words, was it just a black sar, or had you done anything relative to the ear?
 - A- I took the grill out.
- 9- And what about hub sapa, work there any hab sapa on the
 - A- On the front I shink there was.
 - Q- And before you got to Bartlott's bouse where did you some
 - A- W apartment.
 - q- And where is your apartment located?
 - A- 485 North 10th.
 - Q- And that's here in Lincoln, Lameaster County, Mobranka?
- A- 786.
- e- Now how did you get out to the Martiet bause, what
 - A- 10th Stroot.
- 22 G- And did you so straight north on loth Street?
- 23 & %08.
- 24 Q- And how far morth did you so, Charles?
- 23 A- I think I want down to 12th --

Yes.

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- Q- And did you park right in front of the house?

 A- Well, right in front of the mailbox.
- Q- And did you have anything with you when you went out there?

A- Yes.

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- Q- What did you have?
 - A- I had two rugs and a 22 rifle.
- Q- Where were the rugs, Charles?
 - A- In the car.
- 10 Q- New big a rugs were they?
 - A- one was long shaped like this table (indicating), and assether one was a kind of a square one.
 - 6- And were they in the front seat of the ear or back seat of the ear?
 - A- Back.
- A- One was kind of a bluish red, and the ether one was a kind of a red and yellow.
 - Q- And where had those rugs come from?
 - A- My place, I found them.
- 21 Q- You found them up at your apartment?
 - A- No, I found them.
- 23 Q- I see. And why were the rugs in your ear?
 - A- Well, I was, I asked Mrs. Bartlett if she wanted
- them, and she said yes.

(Statement of Charles R. Starkweather)

- Q- You asked her on some other occasion, is that right?
 - A- Yes.

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- Q- And you also had a 22 caliber rifle?
 - A- Yes.
- Q- Whose rifle was that, Charles?
 - A- That was my brother's.
- Q- And which brother are you referring to?
 - A- Rodney.
- 9 Q- What kind of an action did that have on it?
- A- Bolt action.
 - Q- Bolt action; and did you have any shells with you at that time?
- 13 A- Yes.
- 14 Q- Where were the shells?
 - A- Well, in my jacket, there was a little pocket that
- 16 I always carry them in there.
- 17 Q- Now many shells would you say that you had?
- 18 A- About two boxes.
- 19 Q- And was the gun loaded at the time that it was in the
- 20 GAP?
- 21 A- No.
- 22 Q- And you hadn't loaded it at all before going out there,
- I take it?
- 24 A- No.
- 25 Q- Now after you got out there and got out of the car, I

- 20 A- I never did talk to him.
- 21 Q- You never did talk with him. And was there anybody
- else in the house other than Mr. and Mrs. Bartlett?
- A- No -- yes, there was Betty Jean.
- 24 Q- And who is Betty Jean?
- A- Caril's stepsister.

- Q- And about how old is Betty Jean? 1 A- Two, three, I don't know. Q- Now had you known Betty Jean before? 3 A- What do you mean? 4 Q- Well you had seen Betty Jean before when you had been 5 out there, is that right? 6 A- Yes. 7 Q- And had you and Caril had some conversation about Betty 8 Jeant 9 A- Like what? 10 Q- Well, just about Betty Jean and what Caril thought of 11 Betty Jean? 12 A- Yes. Q- And that was, of course, before this date, is that right? 14 A- Yes. 15 Q- What sert of conversation was that, Charley? 16 A- She was a little snot. 17 18 Q- And was that your opinion or was that Caril's? 19 A- That was mine; her opinion was that she was a 20 monster or something. 21 Q- And she called her a what? 22 A- A monster, about every name that you can think of. 23 I see; and did she give you any reason for calling her

- Q- Did Caril ever say to you that she didn't like her little sister?
 - A- A few times.
- Q- What did she say why she didn't like her?

 A- She was a stepsister is one reason.
- Q- Did she say anything about Marion Bartlett's treatment toward her, Caril, and toward the little girl?
 - A- What?

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- Q- Did she say anything about the way that Mr. Bartlett treated Barbara Jean, was it?
 - A- Barbara Jean?
- Q- Is that the little girl?
 - A- Betty Jean.
- 14 Q- Betty Jean; and did Caril say anything about the way Mr.
 15 Bartlett treated Betty Jean and Caril?
- A- Well, she -- he treated Betty Jean far more than he ever did Caril.
- 18 Q- And did Caril tell you that?
- 19 A- Yes; she used to gripe about it all the time.
- 20 Q- All right. What were some of the reasons that she
 21 thought that he was treating Betty Jean better than he
 22 was Caril?
- A- Well, I don't know, he just, just let her have things
 that he wouldn't let Caril, I guess.
- 25 Q- What sort of things would he let her have and not let

Caril have?

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A- Well, if she wanted a pair of shees he'd go downtewn and buy them.

- Q- You mean whem the little girl wanted a pair of shoes?

 A- Yes, semething like that.
- Q- And what did Caril think about that?

 A- She didn't like it too well.
- Q- Well now, you kind of liked Caril quite a bit, didn't you, at that time?

A- Yes.

Q- As a matter of fact you were pretty much in leve with her, weren't you?

A- Yes.

- Q- And you used to buy her a few things too, didn't you?
- Q- What did you used to buy her, Charley?

A- You name it, it's there.

Q- What?

A- You name it, it's there.

Q- You bought her just about everything; well, did you ever buy her any pets, Charley?

A- A dog.

0- What kind of a dog was that?

A- I don't know, he's supposed to be a male, I den't

know what kind he was.

 Q- And that was this last Christmas, is that right?

 A- Yes.
- Q- How much did you pay for the dog?

 A- Five dellars.
 - Q- And whose money was that, Charley?
 - Q- Did Caril centribute anything toward 1t?
- 19 Q- And where had you gotten the money?
 20 A- Well, I worked.
- 21 Q- And where was that?
- 22 A- Oh, Harry Niederhouse.
- 23 Q- Harry Niederhouse; and what kind of work was that,
- 24 Charley?

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25 A- That was on the garbage route.

Q- Now much did you earn on the garbage route, did you get paid by the hour or by the day? A- By the week. 3 Q- And how much did you get by the week? 4 A- I don't know, it was about forty-two dollars, 5 something like that. 6 Q- I didn't hear you. 7 A- It was about forty-two dollars. Q- About forty-two dollars a week; and how long had you 9 worked for him? 10 A- Oh, about, ever since, before Christmas. 11 Q- Just after Christmas? 12 A- No, it was before Christmas. Q- And were you living with your dad at that time, Charley? A- No. Q- By the way, what is your dad's name? A- Quy. 17 18 Q- Ouy Starkweather? A- Yes. 19 Q- And what is your mether's name? A- Helen. 21 Q- Helen Starkweather? 22 23 A- Yes. 9- And where do they live, Charley?

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A- 3025 N.

Q- And just for my own information, Charley, what is your 1 birthday? A- November the 24th. 3 And what year were you bern? 4 A- Thirty-eight. 5 19389 6 Q-7 A- Yes. 8 Q- And where were you born? 9 A- Here in Lincoln. 10 Q- And was that at a hospital or home? A- I believe it was at a heme, 11 Q- You are not quite sure of that, I take it? 12 A- I'm pretty sure it was. 15 14 Q- New how many brothers and sisters do you have? 15 A- At home or away or both? 16 Q- Yes, at home and away, both. 17 A- I've got one sister. 18 Q- And what is her name? 19 A- Lavoda . Same 20 And how do you spell that, do you know? 21 A- No. 22 And how old is she approximately? 23 A- Sixteen, she's going to be seventeen. 24 Q- Does she go to school?

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A- Yes.

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Q- Where does she go to school?
       A- Lincoln High.
   Q- And then you have some brothers?
       A- Yes.
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   Q- And what's your brother's name?
       A- Which one?
   Q- All of them.
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       A- Well, there's Leonard.
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   Q- Where does he live?
       A- Washington.
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   Q- State of Washington?
       A- Yes.
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   Q- Do you know the town where he lives?
       A- Bellevue, I believe, I ain't for sure.
   Q- You're not sure of that. And what is your other brother's
       name
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       A- Rodney.
18 'Q- And where does he live?
       A- On H.
   Q- He lives on H Street here in Lincoln?
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       A- Yes, 12th, and 11th, I don't know the address.
   Q- What type of work does he 60?

       A- He's on that same garbage route that I was on.
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25 A- Yes; I was working with him.

Q- That you worked on too?

Q- And do you have any other brothers and sisters new? A- Bob. Q- And Bob; where is he? A- No's home. Q- And how old is he about? A- Fifteen, fourteen. 6 4- And de you know where he goes to school? A- Whittier. Q- And do you have any other brothers and sisters now? A- Bavid. 10 11 Q- And Bavid, and about how old is David? A- Ten. 12 Q- And I assume that he's at home. 14 A- Yes. Q- And do you know where he goes to school? 15 16 A- Ellioss. Q- Elliots? 18 A- Yes. 19 And de you have any other brethers and sisters? 20 A- Gregg. 21 Gregg; and where does he live? 22 A- The same. 23 Mame ? 24 A- Yes.

 - A- He didn't de nething.
- Q- Did he stay in the kitchen?

A- Yes.

- Q- And what die Mrs. Bartlett do after she looked over the rugs there in the living room?
 - A- Well, she went back out into the kitchen.
- 22 Q- Do you know what she did out there?
- 23 A- / No.
- 24 Q- And what did you do?
- 25 A- Well, I was sitting there on the sough.

- Q- And where is the coupr. located, Charles?
 - A- On the west wall of the room.
- Q- And is there anything else along that west wall of the living room that you recall?
 - A- I think there's a closet, dresser, a closet more like.
- Q- A sort of a closet?

A- Yes.

- Q- And which is closer to the street, Charley, the couch that you were sitting on or the closet?
 - A- The closet.
- Q- So that the closet would be south of the couch, is that right?
 - A- Yes.
- Q- And where was Betty Jean, is that the little girl's name?
 A- Yes.
- Q- And where was she at this time while you were sitting on the couch?
 - A- In the kitchen.
 - Q- And so Mr. and Mrs. Bartiett and Betty Jean were in the kitchen, is that right?
 - A- Yes.
- Q- And how long did you sit on the couch?
 - A- Well, I don't know, maybe ten, fifteen minutes.
 - Q- And then what happened, Charles?
 - A- Well, Mr. Bartlett he went on in and went to, why,

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It was a big one?

A- Big enough.

he went on into the other room and laid down most likely. Q- And what room would that be? A- It would be the southwest bedroom. Q- And did he go through the room that you were in at that time to get there? A- Yes. Q- And what did Mrs. Bartlett do? A- Well, she -- her and Betty Jean went on into Caril's room. Q- Into Caril's rosm? A- Yes. Q- And where is Caril's room lesated? A- Worthwest. Q- And that's a bedreem, is it? A- What? Q- And that's a bedroom? A- A bedroom, yes. Q- Did it have the bed in it? A- A bed? Q- Did it have a bed in it? A- Yes. Q- And what kind of a bod was in that room, do you remember? A- A king size, it was a big one.

 you put the bolt lever action in the gun, is that right?

 A- Yes.
 - Q- And is that the time that you also leaded the gun?
- Q- Is that an automatic that you are talking about, or does
 1 it just sheet one shot at a time?
 - A- A single.
- 23 Q- A single shot?
- A- Yes.
- Q- But do you put more bullets into the gan, is it a pump

action gun, did you tell me?

- A- It was a single action.
- Q- I see. Well, I don't know too much about guns; can you explain that to me in a little more detail?
 - A- It just holds one bullet.
- Q- And that's all you can put in at one time?
 A- Yes.
- Q- And did you put a bullet in at that time when you were on the couch?
 - A- No.
- Q- All right now, after you got this bolt in the gun, then
 what happened, Charles, and Mr. Bartlett had gone
 apparently into the scuthwest bedroom, and Mrs. Bartlett,
 and is it Betty Jean, went into the northwest bedroom
 into Caril's reom, and you got this bolt into the gun,
 and what did you do?
 - A- I went on into the bedroom there.
 - Q- And when you say you went on into the bedroom, what bedroom do you refer to?
 - A- Caril's bedraom.
- Q- And was Mrs. Bertlett and Betty Jean in there at that time?
 - A- Yes.

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- ,- Now who was -- were they both laying on the bed?
 - A- No, just her, the little girl was --

- Q- The little girl was not in bed?
 - A- Yes. Cre we can

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- Q- And where was Mrs. Bartlett laying, in the middle of the bed or laying on one side or the other? A- Laying on one side.
- Q- And which side would she be laying?
 A- On the south.
- Q- And would that be elesest to the door or farther away from the door?
 - A- Closest.
- Q- And what was Betty Jean doing?

 A- Messing around with the radio.
- Q- There's a radio in that room at that time?
 A- Yes.
- Q- Where was the radio located?

 A- On the west wall.
- Q- On the west wall?

 A- Sitting on a stand.
- 19 Q- And de you knew what kind of radio it was?
 - A- Oh, I don't know, I, I gave it to her, I don't know what kind it was.
 - Q- You had given her the radio?
 - Q- Was there anything else in that room that you had given her, Charles?

- A- I don't know what's in there that I never gave her.
- 9- You think that you gave her just about everything that she had in that room, is that right?

 A- About everything.
 - Q- Well now, you're in the room, did you have the gun in the
 - A- Well, I just walked in and stood it against that wall.
 - Q- You stood it against the wall?

 A- That would be the west wall.
- Q- You stood the gun up against the well, is that right?
 A- Yes.
- Q- In the bedroom?

- Q- And then what did you go into that room fer, Charles?

 A- I went in to as': her if he was going to go hunting.
 - Q- If Mr. Bartlett was going to go hunting?
 A- Yes.
- Q- Why didn't you go into his bedroom and ask him that?

 A- Me and him didn't get along too good, he give me a

 dirty look when he walked by.
- A- No.
- A- Sust a dirty look.

- Q- Had he given you those looks before?
 - A- Yes, when he was unhappy.
- Q- And then what did you ask her when you went into that room?
 - A- I just asked her if she knew if he was going hunting or not.
- Q- And what did she say?
 - A- She said she didn't think he was.
 - Q- And what did you say?
 - A- I said "Why?"
 - Q- And what did she say?
 - A- I don't know.
- Q- You don't remember?
 - A- No.
- 15 . Q- Did she make some smart remark to you?
 - A- No; I think she just said he wasn't going to go.
 - Q- And then what did you say?
- 18 A- I just sat down, there was a kind of an orange crate
 19 setting there.
 - Q- And was that on the bed that you set down?
 - A- No; it was on the, by a closet.
- Q- By a closet; and did the closet have some clothes in it?
 - Q- And where would that eleget be in the room?

 A- On the south wall.

- Q- And then what happened after you were setting there?

 A- Oh, she began telling me that I'd have to leave and couldn't come back.
- Q- That you'd have to leave and couldn't come back?
 A- Yes.
- Q- And what did you say about that?

 A- "Why?"
- Q- And what did she say?

 A- Well, I don't remember what she says, she just says she didn't want me seeing Caril.
- Q- Mad she told you that before, Charles?
 - Q- Well you and Caril had discussed it before, hadn't you?

 A- About what?
- Q- Well about your seeing her and about her folks not liking

 by you to see her?
 - A- No.

- 18 Q- You had never discussed that before?

 19 A- No.
 - Q- I thought you told one of the officers that you talked about that before, Charley.
 - A- About her and I what --
- A- No.
- Q- Well in any event what reason did she give you that she

didn't want you to see Caril?

A- She didn't give anything.

- a- And then what did you say or do after she told you that, to get out and never come back?
 - A- I don't know; I gave her some wisecrack, and she got mad.
- Q- What kind of a wisecrack was that?
 - A- I don't remember.
- Q- What?
 - A- I don't remember.
- 11 Q- Well did you cuss her a little bit?
 - A- No; I didn't cuss her at all.
- 13 Q- Well what kind of wisecrack do you think it was?
 - A- Oh, go to hell, or something, I don't know.
- 15 Q- And what did she say?
- A- She didn't say nothing, she just got up and slammed
- the shit out of me.
- 18 Q- Well, where did she hit you?
- 19 A- In the face.
- 20 Q- On the side of the face?
- 21 Yes.
- 22 Q- What hand did she use?
- 23 A- I don't know; it came at me too fast to see what
- hand it was.
 - Q- She came up off the bed?

(Statement of Charles R. Starkweather) A- Yos. 1 Q- And how many times did she hit you? A- Two or three. 3 Q- And what 41d you do? 4 A- I just sat there. Q- It didn't bother you too much? 6 A- Yes; I got up and left. 7 9- Did you take the gun with you? 8 9 A- No; I forgot all about it. Q- I see; and did it make you kind of mad when she slapped 10 YOM? 11 A- A little bit. 12 13 Q- What? A- A little bit. 14 Q- What did you say to her? 15 15 A- Nothing. 17 Q- What? 18 A- Mothing. 19 Q- You just got up and left? 20 A- Yes. 21 Bid you have any bruises on your face? 22 A- No. 23 Well where did you go when you left?

Q- Well why did you go back?

A- I left my gun there.

Q- You went back after your gun?

- 17 Q- And you had a hunting knife with you, is that right?
 - A- Noo. no had a butsler Knife C 5
- 19 Q- What kind of knife was that, Charley?
 - A- Oh, about six-inch blade, something like that.
- 21 Q- Now was it shaped?
 - A- Well, it eams over like this (indicating).
- 23 Q- Do you know what a Bewie knife is?
 - A- Something like a Bowie knife.
 - and was that the type of knife that it was, semething

like a Bowie knife?

A- Yes.

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Q- And then did you also have in your hand the knife that
Nrs. Bartlett had them?

A- Yes. when i went into me Backlett C.S.

Q- And what did you do with it?

A- Well, I went on in, and, and Mr. Bartlett was moving around quite a bit, so I tried to stab him in the side, but the knife wouldn't go in, so I hit him in the throat with it.

- Q- You hit him in the threat with the knife?
- 13 Q- And did you throw it at him or did you have it in your
 14 hand and stab him?
 - A- Well, I started to push it in, and it wouldn't go in, and I just hit the top part of it with my hand, and it went in.

- Q- Now while you were staying in the Gering jail -- A- Yes, I seen them (indicating).
- 2- You saw the pictures. I went to check and make sure that they got the right pictures. You want to look at them again?

No; I looked at them once, I know what they say.

Q- what so they say?

A- dell, I don't know.

well, for my benefit, Charley, will you look at the mandwriting on them and the pictures and tell me whether that is your handwriting?

A- dhy?

.- Because I want to mark them as an exhibit here and give them to the court reporter.

A- I looked at them once.

A- Yes.

MR. FAHRMBRUCH: And would you mark these as Exhibits A, B, C and D?

(The said Exhibits A, B, C and D, were marked for identification by the reporter.)

Q- And, Charley, what the reporter has marked as Exhibits

A, B, C and D, you have new identified these has your

handwriting, is that right?

A- Yes.

Q- Now I'm going to show you another picture which the court reporter is going to mark as Exhibit E.

- 21 A- No.
- Q- Did I threaten you with anything?
- A- Not yet.
- 24 Q- What?
- A- No.

- Okay.

Mr. Henninger, that you think I should ocver?

JESTIONS BY LIEUTENANT HENNINGER:

- There was only one point that Charles told me this afternoon, a little more specific, just prior to leaving the Ward home.

- You told me you were in the bathroom washing and doing your toilets, is that correct?
 - A- That's right.

- Ten minutes. Did you get a little perturbed or did
 you want to see where she was?

 A- Yes, one of the two; I didn't pay much attention

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former schoolhouse was where the Jensen and King boy and girl were left, did Caril tell you that she had to so to the restroom?

Yes.

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- Q- Did she go to the restroom?

- charles, did you make a statement to me this afternoon that something had been poked in the King girl?

 A- Yes.

A- Yes.

There's another point I'd like to talk to you about;

whose idea was it to call up Barbara, who was Rodney's

wife, and give her this story about you being at Tate's?

A- Caril's.

Q- What was it that you called up and stated to Rodney's wife?

A- It wasn't Rodney's wife, it was VonBusch's wife.

- Go ahead then.

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A- Well, I called her up and told her, give them
the idea that I was coming by Tate to give them the
idea I wasn't out to Bartlett's; and I hung up, and
I thought of what Caril said, and I went back and
called her up and told her that I was out there
Tuesday night, and Caril wouldn't let me in the house,
