Dear General Melasky:

With sincere regrets I note that orders issued today detach the 86th Infantry Division from the III Corps. I want to thank you, your officers and your men not only for a superior execution of all missions assigned, but also for a very cheerful and aggressive fighting spirit.

The 86th Division was attached to the III Corps on 19 April 1945. It had just closed from a long and difficult march from the Ruhr Basin where it had participated magnificently in the reduction of that German pocket of resistance. With little opportunity for rest and maintenance the division was assigned a zone of advance on the right flank of the Corps.

After a difficult operation of infiltrating southeast through elements of the XV Corps which moved south through the division zone, the 86th launched a coordinated attack on 24 April, which continued relentlessly for nine days and nights until halted by Army order on 2 May. The division advanced over extremely difficult terrain defended by German forces of all arms.

The advance of the 86th Division covered a distance of 125 miles by air-line, in excess of 175 miles by roads and a much greater distance by foot elements. Four major water obstacles - the Altmuhl, Danube, Isar and the Inn Rivers - and innumerable minor ones were forced by assault action. The division spearheaded the attack of the III Corps and was always in advance of units on either of its flanks. By brilliant maneuver and aggressive action it quickly seized Eichstatt on the Altmuhl, Ingolstadt on the Danube, Freising on the Isar and Wasserburg on the Inn.

The 86th Division captured 14,092 prisoners, great quantities of enemy materiel and supplies and recovered many thousands of Allied prisoners of war. The operation represents what can be accomplished by bold and aggressive action and stands out as a classic example of long and continued advance in the face of almost insurmountable difficulties. These successes are the results of good training, bold action, brilliant and aggressive leadership, and a desire on the part of all ranks to fight and get the job done.

When the advance of the III Corps was ordered stopped by Third Army on 2 May, the Army Commander directed that I express to all units his thanks and appreciation for a job well done and, in his words, "particularly to the officers and men of the 86th Division." It is a great pleasure and privilege for me to commend you for the magnificent accomplishments of your fine division.

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I--INTRODUCTION.

1. Provisions of this circular will govern the preparation and submission of personnel replacement requisitions and reports, required in perfecting the personnel readjustment of units being redeployed through the Assembly Area Command, either directly to another theater, or through the United States for further redeployment or reversion to the strategic reserve. Provisions of this circular are not applicable to units being redeployed to the United States for demobilization, or to permanent units of the Assembly Area Command.

2. The following personnel replacement requisitions and personnel reports will be submitted by each unit or organization to be redeployed through the Assembly Area Command:

a. Initial Personnel Replacement Requisition, submitted by every division or separate unit to be redeployed, having authorized vacancies for personnel, or which will have such vacancies after withdrawal of personnel who should be cleared under provisions of current directives. Subsequent Personnel Replacement Requisitions will be submitted as necessary to cover normal attritional losses, or potential losses due to determination that additional personnel should be cleared from units.

b. Part II of Status Report, as required in Appendix A, ETO-SOP No 61, ETO-POM-RED, dated 19 May 1945, and Changes No 2 thereto, dated 9 June 1945.

c. Personnel Shortages Report, as required in paragraph 30c, ETO-SOP No 61, ETO-POM-RED, dated 19 May 1945.

d. Final Personnel Report as required in paragraph 32d, SOP No 60, REAP, dated 15 May 1945.

3. Sub-Area Commanders are responsible that all requisitions and reports provided for in this circular are properly prepared and submitted to agencies at the time indicated.

II--PREPARATION AND SUBMISSION OF PERSONNEL REPLACEMENT REQUISITION.

1. By Whom Submitted: Personnel Replacement Requisition will be prepared and submitted by the Commander of every division or separate unit to be redeployed,

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having authorized vacancies for personnel, or which will have such vacancies after withdrawal of personnel who should be cleared under provisions of current directives. In the event no additional personnel are authorized, and no known vacancies will occur due to withdrawals, a letter will be initiated to the Commanding General, Assembly Area Command, through channels, stating this fact.

2. When Submitted: Initial Personnel Replacement Requisition will be submitted within 48 hours of the closing in the Assembly Area Command of the unit to submit requisition.

3. Information to be Contained:

a. Personnel Readiness Date: The Personnel Readiness Date will be entered, without identification as such, in the upper left corner of the requisition form.

b. Morning Report Strength: Morning Report Strength will be broken down into two categories as follows:

(1) Retain: Figure shown under this title will include all personnel who are eligible under current directives for redeployment for further active service.

(2) Withdraw: Figure shown under this title will include all personnel who should be cleared from the unit under provisions of current directives. Replacements will be requisitioned for such personnel. Personnel will not be included under this title until it is determined that existing directives for clearance are applicable.

c. Authorized Strength: Authorized strength will be broken down to show totals authorized under War Department Tables of Organization, including, without separate identification, all War Department changes thereto. If Movement Orders authorize additional strengths, these authorizations will be separately identified. A separate figure, equal to two percent of total enlisted authorizations as above, will be entered, and a final grand total shown as the basis for requisition. (Two percent overstrength referred to above is not authorized in the case of officers.)

d. Previous Requisitions: The first requisition submitted by a unit assigned to the Assembly Area Command will supercede all previous requisitions, and consequently the entry "This requisition supercedes all previous requisitions" will be made opposite the item "Previously requisitioned; not yet received".

e. Identification of Vacancies and Potential Vacancies: Requisition for specialists, both officers and enlisted men, will be broken down into categories as follows:

(1) Required to Bring to T/O Strength: This portion of the requisition will be prepared in the normal manner, regardless of personnel who should be cleared from the unit. For units whose actual strength equals or exceeds total authorized strength, entry under this heading will be "none" (See note

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below).

(2) Personnel to be Cleared: This portion of the requisition will be divided into two sub groups as follows:

(a) Candidate Personnel: Included under this heading will be requisition for replacements for personnel whose Adjusted Service Rating Score equals or exceeds the applicable Critical Score, except such Candidate Personnel who must be cleared from the unit for reason in addition to the fact that they are Candidates.

(b) Other Personnel to be Cleared: Included under this heading will be requisition for replacements for all personnel who must be cleared from the unit for reasons other than or in addition to the fact that they possess Adjusted Service Rating Scores equal to or above the applicable Critical Score. The particular reason under which it has been determined that this personnel must be withdrawn will be shown on the requisition form, with the totals for each reason as in the example below:

(This total must agree with the total shown under "Required" for personnel requisitioned under the heading "Other Personnel to be Cleared.")

NOTE: Units in which the actual strength exceeds the total authorized strength, and in which replacements will be required for some but not all of the personnel to be cleared, will requisition their potential requirements as above, and will enter on the requisition, below identification of requirements, the statement "To be cleared from Unit, No Replacement Authorized", with a figure representing the difference between the present amount of overstrength in the unit and the total personnel to be cleared for whom replacements are required. This figure will be broken down as in b above to show any personnel who would require clearance under existing directives regardless of unit strength.

f. Identification of Specialists Requisitioned as Overstrength: Personnel requisitioned against authorizations for overstrength which do not specify the specialists authorized, will be specially identified by showing the entry under "Required" in parenthesis, and by such entries under "Authorized" and "Present" as will make it clear that the particular specialist requisitioned is an overstrength requirement.

g. Grades of Personnel Requisitioned: In accordance with the policy stated in paragraph 33b ETO-SOP No 60, REAP, the grades of personnel requisitioned will be such as to fill all vacancies for promotion after the withdrawal of all personnel to be cleared from the unit.

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4. Classification: All requisitions will be classified "Restricted".

5. To Whom Submitted: Copies Required: Requisitions will be addressed to the Commanding General, 6960th Reinforcement Depot, APO _____, and will be submitted in seven copies through the Camp Headquarters concerned.

6. Additional Replacement Requisitions: Additional personnel replacement requisition will be submitted in case of normal attritional losses, or in case additional personnel are determined to require withdrawal from the unit under provisions of current directives. Such requisitions will be submitted in exact accordance with the above, except that the requisition will supplement (not supersede) other requisitions submitted since the unit was assigned to the Assembly Area Command.

7. Action of Camps and Sub-Area Commanders:

a. Expeditious Action on replacement requisitions will be taken in all cases, regardless of the time that may be available between date of receipt of report and Personnel Readiness Date of the reporting unit. Such expedited action is required in order to permit the unit the benefit of the largest possible number of personnel from which selections for its requirements may be made, and to train new personnel as long as possible prior to the unit departure.

b. Camp Commanders, after necessary action to assure that requisitions are technically correct, will forward requisitions in quintuplicate to the Sub-Area Commander.

c. Sub-Area Commanders will further check requisitions for technical correctness, and after making any necessary corrections, will forward requisitions in quadruplicate direct to the Commanding General, 6960th Reinforcement Depot, APO _____, approved for the Commanding General, Assembly Area Command. Approval will be entered on the requisition form itself. One information copy of each requisition, marked as such, will be forwarded to the Commanding General, Assembly Area Command.

III--PREPARATION AND SUBMISSION OF PART II, STATUS REPORT:

1. Reference Appendix A, ETO-SOP No 61, ETO-POL-RED, dated 19 May 1945, and Changes No 2 thereto, dated 9 June 1945, Part II of Status Report will be submitted to Headquarters, European Theater of Operations, US Army, as a separate report by the Commanding General, Assembly Area Command, for all units to be redeployed through the Assembly Area Command.

2. By Whom Prepared: Part II of the Status Report will be prepared and submitted by the commander of every unit organized under a separate organizational authority, such as a Table of Organization, and which is identified by a separate shipment number in Overseas Movement Orders. Accordingly, this report normally will be submitted by each regiment, separate battalion, separate company, or corresponding units in service organizations. In the case Overseas Movement Orders have not been received prior to due date of the report, the report will

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be prepared by each unit which earlier prepared Part I of the Status Report under the major command to which formerly assigned, entries calling for Ship-ment Number being left blank. In the event it is not known on what unit basis Part I of the report was submitted to Headquarters, European Theater of Operations, US Army, the unit commander will contact the Camp Commander concerned for instructions.

3. Form to be Used: Part II of the Status Report will be prepared on the form prescribed in above references, or any future changes thereto.

4. When, to Whom Submitted, and Copies Required: Part II of the Status Report will be forwarded under Wrapper Indorsement to the Commanding General, Assembly Area Command, through normal channels. Report will be delivered to the Camp Headquarters concerned not later than 20 days prior to the Personnel Readiness Date of the reporting unit. Report will be submitted to the Camp Headquarters in nine (9) copies.

5. Action Prior to Submission of Report:

a. Replacements: Immediately prior to preparation of Part II of the Status Report, the Unit Commander preparing the report will contact the Camp Commander concerned to determine whether or not any appropriate replacements are known to be available prior to the Personnel Readiness Date of the unit. If such replacements are known to be available, corresponding allowances will be made in the report.

b. Boards of Review: To the maximum extent practicable, Camp Commanders will cause the case of each candidate to be retained in the unit by reason of military necessity to be reviewed, prior to the preparation of Part II of the Status Report, by a Board of Officers appointed in accordance with letter, Headquarters, Assembly Area Command, subject: "Boards of Review", dated 15 June 1945. However, it is not desired that Boards of Review attempt to examine such cases until reasonably definite information is available regarding the availability of replacements.

6. Remarks: Unit commanders preparing Part II of Status Report will enter on the report form appropriate remark in cases in which time available prior to due date of report did not permit adequate determination of the availability of replacements.

IV--PREPARATION AND SUBMISSION OF PERSONNEL SHORTAGES REPORT:

1. General: Reference paragraph 30c, ETO-SOP No 61, ETO-POM-RED, vacancies which cannot be filled by the Assembly Area Command within seven (7) days prior to the anticipated date of the units departure to a Staging Area, will be reported to Headquarters, European Theater of Operations, US Army, showing numbers by grade, SSN and race (White or Negro). This report will be known as the Personnel Shortages Report.

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2. By Whom Submitted: Personnel Shortages Report will be prepared and submitted by the commanders of each division or separate unit being redeployed.
3. When Submitted: Personnel Shortages Report will be submitted seven (7) days prior to the Personnel Readiness Date of the reporting unit.
4. To Whom Submitted: Copies Required: Personnel Shortages Report will be addressed to Commanding General, Assembly Area Command, and will be forwarded through the Camp and Sub-Area Headquarters involved. Report will be submitted to the Camp Headquarters in quintuplicate.
5. Form and Information to be Contained: Personnel Shortages Report will be in the form of a military letter, subject: "Personnel Shortages Report".
 - a. The first paragraph of this letter will make appropriate reference to ETO-SOP No 61, ETO-POM-RED and Part IV of this circular.
 - b. The second paragraph will show in tabular form the number of personnel by branch, MOS, job title and race (White or Negro), officers and enlisted men separately, required to bring the organization up to the total strength authorized. Overstrengths authorized by Movement Orders, and the two percent enlisted overstrength authorized all units to be redeployed, will be separately identified by SSN as "Overstrength Requirements".
 - c. The third and any further appropriate paragraphs of this letter will indicate action taken to determine whether or not any additional reinforcements are enroute to the unit at the time of preparation of the report. If such reinforcements are enroute, or if information is obtained that a shipment is likely to be made, appropriate remark will be made, identifying where possible the change that receipt of such reinforcements will make in the vacancies reported. Reporting unit commanders will contact the Camp Headquarters concerned in determining whether reinforcement shipments are enroute.

V--PREPARATION AND SUBMISSION OF FINAL PERSONNEL REPORT.

1. General: Reference paragraph 32d, ETO-SOP No 60, REAP, dated 15 May 1945, any vacancies existing, or candidates remaining in Category II A or Category II B units on their departure from the Assembly Area Command will be reported, by numbers and types, to Headquarters, European Theater of Operations, US Army, by radio for information and cable to the War Department. This report will be known as the final Personnel Report.
2. By Whom Submitted: Final Personnel Report will be submitted by the commander of the same units that earlier submitted Part II of the Status Report, as required in Section III of this circular (every unit organized under a separate organizational authority and which is identified by a separate shipment number in Overseas Movement Orders).
3. When Submitted: Final Personnel Report will be submitted at the last practicable moment before the departure of the unit from the Assembly Area Command, and after it has been ascertained that no additional personnel replacements

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will be received, or additional personnel cleared, prior to departure.

4. To Whom Submitted: Copies Required: Final Personnel Report will be addressed to the Commanding General, Assembly Area Command and will be delivered in duplicate direct by the reporting unit to the Camp Headquarters concerned. Additional information copies will be submitted by the reporting unit to any additional headquarters normally included in channels of correspondence.

5. Information to be Contained: Final Personnel Report will be prepared in the form of a military letter, subject: "Final Personnel Report".

a. The first paragraph of the letter will make reference to paragraph 32d, ETO-SOP No 60, REAP, and to Section V of this circular.

b. The second paragraph will consist of two sub-paragraphs:

(1) Sub-paragraph a will show in tabular form, the number of officers and enlisted men (separately) for whom vacancies exist, showing branch MOS and race (White or Negro). Requirements for overstrength authorized will be identified by MOS as "overstrength requirement".

(2) Sub-paragraph b will show the name, grade, serial number, branch MOS and race of any candidate personnel remaining in the unit, accompanied by the statement "The list of Candidate personnel above represents all of the personnel assigned to this unit who have Adjusted Service Rating Scores equal to or above the applicable critical score. The case of each man has been reviewed by a properly constituted Board of Review, and in each case retention in this unit by reason of military necessity was recommended".

c. The third paragraph will contain statement that action has been taken to assure that no additional reinforcements will be received prior to departure from the Assembly Area Command, and that no additional personnel remain to be cleared from the unit prior to such departure.

6. Action of Camp Commanders: Camp Commanders will ascertain that appropriate board proceedings are on file for each case in which candidate personnel remain assigned to the unit. Upon completion of this action, report will be transmitted by TWX to Headquarters, Assembly Area Command, with information copy to the Sub-Area Headquarters concerned. Report by TWX will not identify names of personnel but will certify that board action has been taken as required in the case of candidate personnel reported. (AG 200.3 OpGA)


