

Note. ¹ Oliver Lamere was born at McCook, South Dakota, February 2, 1879. His father, Frank Lamere, was of three-quarters French blood and one-quarter Winnebago. He was probably born in Wisconsin. His mother, a full-blooded Winnebago, was born in Minnesota. She was of the Bear clan. Oliver Lamere has lived on the Winnebago reservation, in Nebraska, all his life. He attended the Indian school at Geneva, Nebraska, and the Carlisle Indian school for a short time. He worked at farming during the earlier part of his life and was for a time an industrial teacher for the Winnebago and also at the Lower Brulé agency. He has been deputy assessor in Thurston county. In 1915 he was appointed an assistant oil inspector for the Food, Drug, Dairy, and Oil Commission in 1915 and is still so employed. He has from time to time acted as interpreter for the Bureau of Ethnology and has given some attention to the collection of material and data for that institution. Mr. Lamere has a wife and children.
