Biographical Note

Albinus Nance was only thirty years old when elected, the youngest man ever to be chosen as the state's chief executive (although Thomas B. Cuming and J. Sterling Morton, acting governors of the territory, were both 26 when first appointed). Nance was born in Lafayette, Illinois on March 30, 1848. He enlisted in the 9th Ill. Cavalry when only 16 years of age and fought with the regiment in numerous Civil War battles. After the war, he began to study law at Knox College in Galesburg, Ill., and though he left before securing his degree, he was admitted to the bar of Illinois in 1870 at the age of 22. Nance moved to Nebraska in 1871 and attempted to homestead in Polk County and practice law at the same time. His legal work prospered to such a degree that he decided to give it his full attention, and he moved to Osceola to open an office.

Nance was elected to the state house of representatives in 1874, despite the fact that he had been in Nebraska only three years and was only 26 years old. In 1876, he was re-elected and chosen as speaker of the House of Representatives. He also served as Chairman of the Nebraska delegation to the Republican National Convention in Cincinnati.

The Republican Party nominated Nance for the governorship in 1878. He defeated W. H. Webster, the Democratic nominee, by better than a two to one majority. He was renominated by acclamation in 1880, defeating former Senator Thomas W. Tipton in the general election. At the expiration of his second term, Governor Nance, still not 35 years old, "retired" to his law practice at Osceola. A few years later he moved to Lincoln, and then to Chicago, where he engaged in handling railroad stocks and bonds. He died on December 7, 1911.

Scope and Content Note

This subgroup consists of 6 boxes of the papers of Governor Albinus Nance, arranged into 4 series by type of record:

- 1. Correspondence, 1879-1882
- 2. Applications for Commissioner of Deeds, 1879-1883
- 3. Petitions and Proclamations, 1879-1883
- 4. Miscellaneous, 1880-1882

These papers relate to the affairs of the Governor's office during Nance's administration, dating 1879-1883. The bulk of the material consists of incoming correspondence relating to such matters as county organization, crime, immigration, military affairs, elections, appointments and politics. Of special interest are numerous letters and documents relating to the activities of outlaw David "Doc"

Middleton in the Holt Co., Nebraska area. Additional material deals with the Olive Murder trial at Hastings, Nebraska. Also included within the correspondence are letters by Phineas W. Hitchcock and Algernon S. Paddock regarding state and national politics. Records are arranged chronologically within each series.
