In the matter of Evangelistic meetings three things are very essential, the first is preparation for the meeting; the second is calling upon persons and the personal interest during the meeting; the third is the follow-up of the meeting. Each is very important.

The method of Evangelism is not enough. The spirit of Evangelism is very essential.
