Materials relating to Rev. Broz and his parish, St. Wenceslaus Catholic Church, in Dodge, Nebraska.

Clarkson Local Legacy Project (RG5194.AM)

Scrapbook documenting the local Czech festival at Clarkson, Nebraska, in 1999.

Czechoslovansky Cemetery (Ravenna, Neb.) (RG3454.AM)

Located in Sherman County and established in the spring of 1887. Also known as Horak Cemetery.

Czech Fraternal Organizations (Nebraska) (RG1471.AM)

Fifteen volumes of records from various Czech fraternal organizations mostly in and around Wilber, Nebraska.

Czech Reminiscences (RG1606.AM)

Reminiscences from early Czech settlers of Nebraska, Colorado, North Dakota, and Oklahoma.

Laurel Hill Cemetery (Omaha, Neb.) (RG4175.AM)

Burial Cards, 1881-1983 (microfilm).

Nebraska Czechs Incorporated (RG1587.AM)

Organizational history and goals. By-laws of Nebraska Czechs Incorporated.

Miscellaneous material in file labeled "Czechs in Nebraska."

Josef Jungman Literary Society (Valley County, Neb.) (RG1621.AM)

Photocopy of a record book from the Josef Jungman Literary Society in Valley County, Nebraska. The records, all written in Czech, include minutes, membership information, etc.

Milligan Auditorium Corporation (Milligan, Neb.) (RG5028.AM)

Minute book (on microfilm) of the Corporation and architectural drawings relating to the building of the Czech auditorium in Milligan, Nebraska.

Novacek, Alfred T. (RG1615. AM)

Czech researcher and translator who assisted or wrote articles and books on Czech Americans and history of the Czech peoples.

Reicha, Frank (RG1362.AM)

Reminiscences of a Saline County Czech immigrant.

Rosicky, Rose (RG4403.AM)

Scrapbooks, correspondence related to the publication of Rosicky's history of Nebraska Czechs.

Rozanek, Elsa and Adolph (RG5524.AM)

Relates to the polka dance career of this Czech couple.

Sokol South Omaha Local History Project Collection (RG5540.AM)

Documents the history of the Czech neighborhood around Brown Park in south Omaha.

Youth-written essays about Czech heritage. Include family group sheets and pedigree charts.

Nebraska Historic Buildings Survey: (<u>Historic Preservation Survey</u>) This survey documents many buildings constructed by Czech immigrants in Nebraska, as well as several listed in the National Register of Historic Places. It contains information on owners, institutions, builders, and architects, as well as historical narrative. The survey covers pioneer dwellings, lodge and Sokol halls, churches, cemeteries, and farmsteads. For specific inquiries, email <u>Historic Preservation</u>.
