# **Manuscript Collections**

Below is a sampling of the German related material in the Manuscript collection.

#### **American Volga Relief Society (RG4879.AM)**

This collection relates to the starvation of the Volga German colonists in Russia, and the efforts of the American Volga Relief Society to supply food and other aid to the region.

## Beutler, Jacob (RG0729.AM) of Sembach Germany, Nebraska City, Nebraska.

The collection contains two letters in German with English translations.

#### **Ernst, Carl Julius, 1854-1932 (RG3164.AM)**

The bulk of this collection consists of personal correspondence and various family materials of Carl Julius Ernst and the Ernst family. Much of the correspondence is written in German.

#### Forward League (Lincoln, Neb.) (RG4024.AM)

This small collection relates to the Forward League, which was organized in 1917 by the Germans from Russia group in Lincoln, Nebraska to demonstrate their full support of the war effort against Germany during World War I, and their loyalty to the U.S.

#### Grasmick Family (Scotts Bluff, Neb.) (RG5545.AM) (Germans from Russia)

This collection contains the passports of Henry and Catherine Grasmick, biographical and genealogical information about the Grasmick family, and two oversized religious history documents (in German) created by Henry Grasmick.

#### Koenig, William, ?-1863 (RG0790.AM) Berlin; St. Louis, Omaha.

Correspondence includes Koenig's comparisons of his experiences and life on the frontier with his former life in Germany.

#### Krebs, Karl Gottlieb (RG1146.AM)

The collection consists of a diary (in German) kept by Karl Krebs while a missionary among the Indians at Deer Creek Mission.

#### Rohke-Zutz Family (Hoskins, Neb.) (RG5330.AM)

The collection includes family letters and documents written in German.

#### Sack Family (RG5488.AM)

The collection includes genealogical information and correspondence in German about the family.

#### Schormann, August A. (RG5098.AM)

This collection consists of three pages of notes (photocopies only) in German taken by Rev. August A. Schormann in 1918 summarizing talks he gave as a "Four Minute Man" at his church in Staplehurst, Nebraska during World War I.

#### Schwader, Maria (Rickli) (RG1650.AM)

The collection consists of one folder containing typed transcripts [18 pages] of letters written to Maria Rickli Flückiger Schwader by her brother-in-law, Jacob Maurer, her brother, John Ulrich Rickli, and her son, John Fluckiger. They span the dates 1875-1902. The original letters were written in old German script handwriting, from which the translated transcripts were made.

#### Staack-Ehmen Family (RG4198.AM)

The collection consists mostly of family correspondence, primarily written in German. English translations are available.

#### Stolley, William, 1831-1911 (RG2617.AM)

The bulk of this collection consists of correspondence dated between 1852 and 1894. Much of this material is written in German script.
