SUGGESTIONS TO CLERKS.

1. While it is the duty of the Church to make a good record, it is the duty of the Clerk to *keep* that record in an intelligent manner for future reference.
2. Full minutes of the church meeting should be kept on sheets of paper, embracing motions lost as well as adopted, and giving the names of those who make the motions, and all other important particulars.
3. The Record made in the book from these minutes should state only what was *done* by the Church, omitting the steps and personal remarks that may have led to the action; and this record should be true and full, written in a plain, legible hand, with good black ink.
4. The Covenant and Rules of the Church should occupy the first pages of the Records, and, in addition to facts entered in the Tables, there should be a *brief* historical Statement of the Church, embracing items like the following:—date of the organization—names of the council—number of members—times of general revival—erection and repair of the meeting-house—sessions of the Yearly Meeting and Anniversaries—new churches organized from this—outside benevolent work, etc.
5. Write in bold letters at the top of every page the *month, day* of the month, and *year* of the meeting recorded below; or this date may stand as the heading of the record of each meeting.
6. Every distinct item of business should begin a new line, and stand as a paragraph by itself, and it may be well to leave a blank line in the records between these items.
7. Several blank lines should be left between the records of different meetings if the record of each meeting does not begin a new page.
8. Keep a record of the call and dismissal of the pastor, the choice of all officers, the names of all committees and delegates, and the admission, dismissal, death, and exclusion of all members; and the marriage names of women should be written under their former names.
9. The annual report of the Clerk should be approved by the Church, and the annual reports of the Pastor and other officers, also of all committees (if short as they ought to be), should be recorded.
10. Make the record in the Tables of the Officers of the Church when the changes occur; and once a year enter in the Tables of Statistics, Money raised and Sabbath School, the annual account, using one line for each year.
11. In dividing the pages for the alphabetical list of members, ascertain by an alphabetical classification what initial letters of family names will probably be used most frequently, and assign to such letters a corresponding space. From two to three pages should be assigned to some letters, while one-half or quarter of a page will be enough for others.
12. The record of the preceding meeting should be read from the book for approval, and not from the minutes.
